1. Rights of Public Entity

Namibia Qualifications Authority reserves the right:

- (a) to split the contract as per the lowest evaluated cost per site, or
- (b) to accept or reject any quotation or to cancel the quotation process; and
- (c) reject all quotations at any time prior to contract award.

2. Preparation of Quotations

You are requested to quote for the services mentioned in Section III, by completing, signing and returning:

- (a) the Quotation Letter in Section II with its annex for Bid Securing Declaration, where applicable;
- (b) the Priced Activity Schedule in Section IV;
- (c) the Specifications and Performance Standards in Section V; and
- (d) any other attachment as deemed appropriate.

You are advised to carefully read the complete Request for Quotations document, including the Contract Data Sheet in Section VII, before preparing your quotation. The standard forms in this document may be retyped for completion but the Bidder is responsible for their accurate reproduction.

3. Validity of Quotations

The quotation validity period shall be for 120 working days from the date of submission deadline.

4. Eligibility Criteria

- (I) detailed cost breakdown (installation, monthly fees, equipment, VAT).
- (j) A bidder that is under a declaration of ineligibility by the Government of Namibia in accordance with applicable laws at the date of the deadline for bid submission or thereafter, shall be disqualified.

Bids from service providers appearing on the ineligibility lists of African Development Bank, European Bank for Reconstruction and Development, Inter-American Development Bank Group and World Bank Group shall be rejected.

9. Opening of Quotations

Quotations will be opened internally by the Public Entity immediately after the closing time referred to in section 8 above. A record of the Quotation Opening stating the name of the Bidders and the amount, the presence or absence of a Bid Security/Bid-Securing Declaration will be put on the website of the Public Entity and available to any bidder on request within three working days of the Opening.

10. Evaluation of Quotations

The Public Entity shall have the right to request for clarifications in writing during evaluation. Offers that are substantially responsive shall be compared on the basis of evaluated cost to determine the lowest evaluated quotation

11. Scope of Services and Performance Standards

The Scope of Services, Specifications and Performance standards detailed in Sections III and V are to be complied with.

12. Price and Currency of Payments

Quotations shall be fixed in Namibian Dollars and all payments will be made in this currency. Quotations shall cover all costs of labour, materials, equipment, overheads, profits and all associated costs for performing the services, and shall include all duties. The whole cost of performing the services shall be included in the items stated, and the cost of any incidental services shall be deemed to be included in the prices quoted.

13. Labour Clause

In order to qualify for award of the Contract, bidders shall subscribe to the undertaking that the salaries and wages to be paid in respect of this bid are compliant with the relevant Laws, Remuneration Order and Award where applicable and that it will abide to the sub-clause 4.6 of the General Conditions of Contract, if it is awarded the contract or part thereof.

COMPREHENSIVE TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

1. Project Title

Provision of Secondary Dedicated Independent 100MB Fibre Internet Services to the Namibia Qualifications Authority (NQA) for a Period of 36 Months

2. Background and Context

The Namibia Qualifications Authority (NQA) currently operates on a primary fibre internet link provided by Telecom Namibia. To enhance redundancy, reliability, and business continuity of internet connectivity, the NQA seeks to procure a secondary, dedicated, independent fibre internet service.

The secondary link will serve as a failover and load-balancing solution, ensuring uninterrupted internet service to NQA operations.

Participation in this bidding process is strictly limited to non-Telecom Namibia resellers or associate service providers, as Telecom Namibia is the current primary line provider.

3. Objective of the Procurement

To secure a reliable, high-availability, and dedicated 100 Mbps fibre internet connection that operates independently of

the existing Telecom Namibia infrastructure, for a contract period of 36 months.

4. Scope of Work

The successful bidder shall be responsible for the supply, installation, configuration, testing, commissioning, and maintenance of a dedicated 100 Mbps symmetric fibre internet link at NQA's Head Office.

4.1 Services to be Provided

- 1. **Dedicated Internet Access (DIA)** at a minimum guaranteed speed of **100 Mbps** (upload and download).
- 2. **Independent last-mile fibre connectivity** that does not traverse or rely on the existing Telecom Namibia infrastructure.
- 3. Provision and installation of all required Customer Premise Equipment (CPE) including routers, fibre termination units, and cabling.
- 4. **Setup of automatic failover integration** between the secondary and primary lines in consultation with NQA ICT.
- 5. Public IP allocation minimum of 5 static IPv4 addresses.
- 6. **24/7 monitoring and technical support** throughout the contract period.
- 7. **Bandwidth management** and reporting tools for utilization tracking.
- 8. Comprehensive Service Level Agreement (SLA) detailing uptime, response times, and penalties for downtime.

The service provider must assign a dedicated account manager and provide regular communication and incident reports to NQA ICT management.

Payment will be made within 30 days after submission of invoice on deliverables completed and accepted and approval by the NQA. Rates shall remain fixed for the duration of the contract unless otherwise agreed in writing.
